Quick Facts for the 2026-2027 Academic Year

- Lexington Christian Academy (LCA) is a co-educational day/boarding school with full boarding facilities located on our North Campus.
- We have 345 students in Grades 6-12.
- 75% of our faculty members hold advanced degrees.
- Our average class size is 15 and our student to faculty ratio is 10:1.
- Tuition is \$41,850 for the Upper School, \$39,350 for Grade 8, and \$37,350 for Grades 6-7.
- 74% of our student body receives some form of financial assistance and/or scholarship.
- Full-credit courses meet three times per week in 55-minutes blocks over the entire school year.

Updates from the Director of College Advising

Members of the Class of 2026 were accepted to many leading institutions including Babson College, Boston College, Boston University, Brandeis University, Carnegie Mellon University, Colgate University, Cornell University, Duke University, Harvard University, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, New York University, Northeastern University, Purdue University, Rutgers University, Royal Welsh College of Music & Drama, Tufts University, University of California-San Diego/Irvine/Davis/Santa Barbara, Universidad Europea de Madrid, University of Illinois-Urbana Champaign, University of Massachusetts-Amherst, University of Maryland, University of Miami, University of Toronto, University of Washington, Villanova University, and Wake Forest University.

100% of LCA graduates had the option to matriculate to 4-year colleges and universities with some electing to undertake a gap year experience.

The average number of applications submitted last year was 10.

Accreditation/Memberships

LCA is accredited by and/or maintains membership in the following organizations: New England Association of Schools and Colleges, National Association of Independent Schools, Association of Independent Schools of New England, Independent School Management, Secondary School Admissions Test Board, New England League of Middle Schools, National Association of Secondary School Principals, the National Association of College Admission Counseling, and the Association of Christian Schools International.

National Merit Scholarship Program

LCA is proud to report that five of our seniors have been named National Merit Commended Students. In the past nine years, 43 students have received National Merit recognition, including: two National Merit Finalists, three National Merit Semi-Finalists, and 38 National Merit Commended Scholars.

Student Population

At LCA, multiculturalism is an essential part of our everyday culture. Our students represent more than 55 communities in the Greater Boston area. Our diversity is also enriched by families from Armenia, Brazil, China, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Egypt, Ethiopia, France, Germany, Ghana, Greece, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, India, Indonesia, Italy, Jamaica, Japan, Kenya, Malawi, Mexico, Nigeria, Puerto Rico, Romania, Russia, Serbia, Spain, South Korea, Sweden, Taiwan, and Venezuela.

Advanced Placement & Honors Program

Advanced Placement courses at LCA include AP Biology, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP Chemistry, AP Computer Science, AP English Language and Composition, AP English Literature, AP European History, AP Physics 2, AP Psychology, AP Spanish, AP Statistics, AP Studio Art, and AP United States History.

The Honors/AP Program includes 30 courses (50 sections) in 7 disciplines with participation by teacher recommendation only.

These scores reflect 29 of our seniors (domestic and international students) as well as our students who receive academic support services.

Advanced Senior Research

In order to provide students with innovative ways to enhance their liberal arts curriculum by exploring areas of interest in greater depth, LCA offers an Advanced Senior Research (ASR) program. Through their work, students admitted to the ASR program, develop a host of skills critical for 21st century learners including analytical reasoning, communications, collaboration, and creative problem solving.

Fine Arts

The Cross Worship and Performing Arts Center provides a state-of-the-art showcase for our arts programs and reflects our commitment to creative exploration and expression. Our Visual Arts program offers Stained Glass, Architecture, Graphic Design, Ceramics, Painting & Drawing, Photography, and AP Portfolio; our Music program offers Wind Ensemble, Music Theory & Composition, Select Chorus, Chamber Singers, Chamber Strings, Chorale, and the Chamber Singers Annual Tour; our Theatre program offers Acting & Improv, 3 major annual productions, Playwriting & Directing, and Technical Theatre.

Athletics

LCA competes as a member of both the New England Preparatory Athletic Council (NEPSAC) and the Eastern Independent League (EIL). Varsity sports include Girls Field Hockey, Boys and Girls Soccer, Boys and Girls Cross Country, Boys and Girls Golf, Boys and Girls Basketball, Wrestling, Boys and Girls Lacrosse, Baseball, and Softball.

Graduation Requirements

- 4 years of English, 3 years of Mathematics, 3 years of Laboratory Sciences (must include Biology), 2 years of World Languages, and 2 years of History (must include United States History). Sufficient additional college preparatory elective coursework is necessary to meet LCA's 27-credit requirement for graduation.
- 4 years of Biblical and Religious Studies – LCA is committed to a scholarly non-sectarian approach designed to familiarize students with the varied historical contexts and literary forms through which God is revealed.

Rank, Grade Calculation, and Distribution

LCA does not report class rank. A student's total grade point average (GPA) is based upon a 4.0 scale for college preparatory courses (A=4.0). Additional weight is given to both Honors and AP courses (A=5.0). Calculation of the GPA does not include Physical Education or Pass/Fail grades.
